# ASSEMBLY MINUTES JUNE 2, 1998

The Assembly was opened by Chair Dan Mielke at 3:15 p.m.

1. Approval of Minutes

Minutes of the May 5, 1998 Assembly meeting were approved as distributed on eastalk.

### II. President's Update

Dr. Gilbert addressed the following issues:

- A. Vice Chancellor Bill Anslow of Administration and Finance was here for two days to discuss Eastern Oregon University and the new budget model. The potential of growth and resources is needed. The visit concluded with a call to Phil Creighton. Drs. Gilbert and Creighton will meet with Bill Anslow. They are "continuously optimistic" about the final proposal.
- B. Vice Chancellor Diane Vines of Corporate and Public Affairs and Secretary of the State Board will be here for two days to learn about Eastern. She will be coordinating Board development programs and have a role in the legislative planning.
- C. Legislature for 1999: faculty salary will have a priority but will be part of a larger message of "access and quality."
- D. Transition The President's house is a state facility. Change has brought up needs for it to be handicap accessible. It would be too costly to upgrade the house to handicap code. A new house has been purchased which is all one level at 809 S. Highland Place.
- E. Commencement: Chancellor Cox, Betty Youngblood and Gail McAllister will participate. Commencement is on Saturday, June 13.

Mike Fischer presented President Gilbert with a gift from Eastern Oregon University Student Government. President Gilbert was also presented the Life-Time Achievement Award from the Oregon Student Association. 2. PBS Adult Learning Services

Linda Schreiner announced that PBS Adult Learning Services offers curriculum support. Brochures are available through Ed-Net. Video's are available and catalogued in Linda's office. Videos can be previewed prior to purchasing.

3. Arts and Sciences Student Achievements

Dr. Sandra Ellston, Dean of Arts and Sciences, gave recognition to student achievements in the areas of Biology, Psychology, Geology, English/Writing, Math and a Phi Kappa Phi scholarship of \$7,000.

## 2. Associate of Arts Degree

A motion to approve the Walla Walla Community College Associate of Arts Degree as satisfying our General Education requirements was made and seconded. A discussion took place. The following questions were raised: a) how do Walla Walla requirements align with EOU form sheets; b) would we expand to other Washington Community Colleges; c) Artistic Creation-would be their humanities; d) is there a periodic review planned for out-of-state community colleges? Other Washington Community Colleges would be considered on a case by case basis. Washington Community Colleges are comparable to Oregon Community Colleges and reviewed by their regulatory agency. EPCC will consider this issue.

The motion passed with a majority voice vote.
